

HOT TOPIC SERIES

scriptures



Matthew 21:23-27; 17:14-20; 1 Peter 5:5-7; Matthew 6:5-13; James 1: 9-12

devotional questions



- What is something of which the world is trying to convince you that goes against the Word of God? What Scripture can you use to refute this?
- How often are we guilty of doing things on our own and not lifting our eyes to Jesus? What can you give totally to God today, not relying on yourself?
- Who in your life have you seen embody humility? How can you show humility today to those around you?
- How does your prayer life reflect your desires? How does your prayer life compare to the balance of requests made in the Lord's Prayer?
- What can you say to someone who mentions manifesting in conversation after this week of devos? How can you point that person in the direction of Jesus?

essential doctrine



The Power of Prayer to God is Much Stronger Than Manifestation | When we attempt to do things by our own power, we are useless and working out of our own agenda. When we pray to our loving Father, He is able to do far more in a moment than we could do alone in a lifetime.

### Christ Connection

This week's devos are about the topic of manifestation. This is a popular topic in today's world as the idea that you can manifest your dream and desires into reality. In Matthew 17:14–20 we see the disciples attempt to do a work of God without submitting to the power of God. They tried to do things on their own agenda and not the will of God. We discuss the biblical practice of prayer and the power behind it when you use God's authority instead of your own. We also discuss the biblical practice of humility and how manifesting puts all the power in our hands. We take on the role as "god" in our life, being full of pride and thinking we can change our lives by ourselves. Both qualities contribute to the idea of manifestation and the perverted kind of prayer that it represents.




- Have you heard of the term manifesting? What are some things you have heard people say surrounding this?

scriptures

devotional questions



- Why would a person choose not to believe in Jesus and live separated from Him for eternity?
- Are there sins in your life that you need to repent of today?

essential doctrine



**Saving Faith:** to trust in Jesus Christ as the Son of God and a living person for the forgiveness of sins and for eternal life with God.

**Sin:** any failure of a person to conform to the design God has for humans and the moral law of God in any act, attitude or nature.

**Repentance:** the changing of a person's mind where once there was no sorrow for sin; the confession of it, renouncing of it, and the sincere commitment to leave it behind in order to walk in obedience with Jesus Christ.

Christ Connection



Jesus' mission on earth had multiple facets, but the culmination of His mission was to be a sacrifice for people who would put their faith in Him to receive eternal life. So knowing who goes to heaven points people straight to the Cross, because if Jesus had never gone to the Cross then no one would be able to go to heaven.

#### in defense



It is important for students to understand that Christianity is based on what Jesus did on the Cross. If Jesus did not die and resurrect, then our faith is meaningless. Our faith is not based on a book, but an event. It is crucial to know that Jesus' body has never been found; no one would argue He did not exist; and there is no good explanation for the explosion of the Christian Church in Rome immediately following the Crucifixion.




- Why do people on the outside of Christianity believe that the faith is so exclusive?



scriptures

devotional questions



- How did Joseph respond to Potiphar's wife? Why?
- Think about your own life. Is there an area in your life where you aren't "fleeing" from sexual sin?
- Rewrite Matthew 5:29–30 in your own words.
- Does your pursuit of purity cost you anything? If it doesn't, why not?
- Why does God take such a strong stance against sexual immorality?
- What strides do you need to take today to better pursue purity in all areas of your life?
- What does it mean for our bodies to be a temple of the Holy Spirit?
- What does it mean for us to have an active faith?

essential doctrine



**Sin:** Sin is normally defined as anything that displeases God. Throughout the Bible, we are taught and shown what sin is. Everything from coveting someone else's possessions to lying to get out of trouble to murdering someone in revenge. A tactic used by Satan to downplay the effects of sin is acceptance. The more and more people accept a sin as common and normal, the more a Christ-follower is apt to accept it as well. Christians fight this cultural war every single day. Our students' friends, coworkers and followers on social media encourage this daily. We, as leaders, must be the ones who call it into the light and hold our students to a higher standard.

## Christ Connection

Sin separated us from our eternal Father, destroying our relationship with God. Sexual sin is no different. It separates us from the love of God. No matter how deep you are into pornography or the physical side of your relationship with your boyfriend or girlfriend, Jesus was sent to cover that sin. His blood was shed so that sin might be forgiven. He came and died on the Cross so that you might be made whole, and your relationship might be mended.

#### in defense



The idea of sex within the confines of marriage is under much fire in our current culture. With the "normalization" of homosexuality and transgender identity, and the misuse of gender pronouns, we must come to the defense of what God has created sex and marriage to be. We must be rooted in the creation story in Genesis 1 and 2. We must know and trust in a God who operates out of purpose and order, not chaos. We are all beautiful and wonderful creations made by an incredibly intricate God. He didn't leave room for interpretations. He was direct and straight-forward.




- What is sexual immorality to you?

- Why is sharing the Gospel a matter of obedience?

essential doctrine



**Preservation of Scripture** | God has chosen to reveal Himself to humanity through the text of Scripture, having inspired it and ensured that it is free from error. God has also made sure throughout the course of history that the biblical text is faithfully preserved for future generations. Our belief in the preservation of Scripture is supported by investigation into how the canon of Scripture was formed and how manuscripts were faithfully transmitted throughout the centuries.

Christ Connection



The Ethiopian eunuch was familiar with the Old Testament prophets but was unable to understand how their message was fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Philip was led by the Holy Spirit to help the eunuch understand how Jesus died on the Cross for our sins and was raised from the dead, in accordance with the ancient prophecies.

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


- Why is it so important that we understand the Gospel?

devotional questions

- What are some unexpected ways you have seen God work in your life or the lives of others?
- Why are we quick to discount some people God might otherwise use in a powerful way?
- How have you seen God take enemies (or those who didn't see eye to eye) and make them brothers and sisters in Christ?

essential doctrine



**Calling** | The calling of God to salvation happens in two ways: externally through the proclamation of the Gospel and internally through the Holy Spirit working in the heart of the person who hears. Both of these callings are essential, and both work together to bring someone to faith in Christ. (2 Timothy 1:8-10).

#### Christ Connection



The conversion and calling of Saul are demonstrations of God's power to save. Through an encounter with the crucified and risen Jesus, this once-hardened persecutor of God's people began his journey to becoming perhaps the greatest missionary the world has ever known. Only the Gospel can transform a public opponent of Christ into a fervent witness to His salvation.

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


- When has God called you to do something that required courage and trust in Him?

scriptures



Colossians 2-3

devotional questions



- Describe the last time you put on a costume.
- What are some ways people try to find salvation apart from faith in Jesus Christ?
- What does it mean to set our minds on the things above?
- What does it mean that sin is ultimately an issue of the heart?
- Why is faith in Jesus necessary for putting to death the deeds of the flesh?
- Can a believer put on the characteristics of Christ without first putting away the characteristics of our sin nature? Why or why not?

essential doctrine



**Union with Christ** | At the heart of our salvation is our union with Christ. The Bible describes salvation as entering into a covenant relationship with God and also describes the Church (which is made up of believers) as the Bride of Christ (2 Corinthians 11:2; Ephesians 5:23–32). Christians believe that Christ dwells in our hearts through faith (Christ in us) and that we are simultaneously dwelling in Him. (Ephesians 3:17; Colossians 1:27; 3:1–4). This union is indissoluble; it will last for all eternity.

Christ Connection



Those who have trusted in Christ have been given a new identity and new nature in Him. The old self and sinful behavior are put away, replaced by the new self and conduct that pleases God. Everything is to be done in the name of Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.

in defense




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- When have you been tempted to put off or put on things which aren't in line with what Scripture teaches?

- How do people in our culture often value the delivery of a message more than its content?
- What are some ways we can recognize false teachers in the Church?
- Why must believers confront those who would preach false messages in the Church?

#### essential doctrine



**Bride of Christ** | The Church is described as the Bride of Christ, faithfully waiting for the day when Christ will return and heaven and earth will be one. Made up of all believers from all tongues and nations, the Church is the Bride that Jesus redeemed. The picture of a bride also speaks to the permanence of Christ's relationship with the Church, for marriage was intended by God to be a lasting covenant between a man and a woman (Genesis 2:24; Matthew 19:5).

### Christ Connection



Jesus proclaimed that He alone is the way a person can be saved and come to the Father. This exclusive claim is at the heart of the Gospel. As followers of Christ, we are to hold fast to the one true Gospel of Jesus and proclaim it to the world as we also confront the false gospels preached by others.

in defense




- What daily steps are you taking to make sure you're familiar with the truth of Scripture?

scriptures

### devotional questions



- How can you remain steadfast in God's true Word and not be easily led astray?
- How does knowing the truth about the Devil change the way we look at sin (1 Peter 5:8)?
- How does knowing that the alternative to being a son of God is to be a son of the Devil affect the way we evangelize?
- We know that we are either rooted in Christ or rooted in the world, with no in-between. How should that affect the way we evangelize (John 8:44)?

### essential doctrine



Jesus is the ultimate victor from the beginning of creation to the end. This truth allows us to have hope for today and for eternity. God has given us His Holy Spirit to give us the power to stand against temptation and say no. This allows us to live victoriously in Jesus today and forever.

#### Christ



**Jesus Reigns:** God has set Jesus higher than any other being. Philippians 2:9-11 says, Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Jesus' being victorious through His death and Resurrection gives us the ability to stand with Him and combat Satan's deceiving evil ways. Our salvation in Him frees us to walk alongside God in the power of the Holy Spirit. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5).




- Jesus will have the final say over Satan. How does this affect the way we see the world?

- How often do you think about the Gospel in your daily life outside of church?
- What are some ways we see Satan reigning in our culture today?
  - How can we apply the truth of the Gospel to these situations?
- What are some common lies the Enemy uses to distract you from who God says you are?
  - What truths from God's Word can you use to fight those lies?
- In what areas of your life does Satan try to instill fear the most?
- What does Satan use to distract you from God's Word?
- What are some examples of temptations that offer temporary satisfaction in your life?
  - How can you remind yourself in those tempting moments of God's better plans for you?
- How does Satan distract us from experiencing abundant life in our walk with Jesus?

essential doctrine



Our battle is against spiritual forces of evil. Ephesians 6:12 reminds us that "our fight is not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, and against spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places." The first step in fighting the battle is recognizing the reality of spiritual warfare that is around us. When we become aware of the Enemy's tactics against us, we can begin to fight them with the truth of God's Word.

## Christ Connection


Because of Christ's work on the Cross, we have power against Satan's tactics. Romans 6:6-7 reminds us that "our old self was crucified with him (Jesus) so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin – because anyone who has died has been set free from sin." Through a relationship with Christ, we are set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness (Romans 6:18). Therefore, we can guard against the schemes of the Enemy.

- What are some ways we see Satan reigning in our culture today?
  - How can we apply the truth of the Gospel to these situations?
- What are some common lies the Enemy uses life to distract you from who God says you are?
  - What truths from God's Word can you use to fight those lies?
- What does Satan use to distract you from God's Word?
  - How can you practically work against these distractions and guard against them?
- What are some action steps you can take today to replace the enemy's efforts with God's protection?

  - How is my prayer life? What does my daily time with God look like?
  - Am I worshipping God or only complaining to Him?
  - Let Mark 9:24 be our prayer today.
- How are you actively going to put on the armor of Christ as we have discussed this week?
- Which part of the armor is hard for you to be "all-in" with?

### essential doctrine



We are to fight our battles by putting on the armor of God: belt of truth, breastplate of righteousness, readiness that comes from the Gospel of peace, shield of faith, helmet of salvation, and sword of the spirit.

## Christ Connection

Christ came so that we could have eternal life. Christ sent His Holy Spirit after He ascended into heaven. John 14:16-17:

And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you.

In our struggles and in the war that we are in each day, we have the Holy Spirit to help us.

- Do you trust God to help you?
- When you hear "our weapons are not worldly" what comes to mind?
- As believers, what are practical steps we can take to "put on" the armor of Christ?

- How will you walk through today knowing that Christ has conquered death?

essential doctrine



Remember: God is an advocate for us. Everything that He has done has been for us. He is a loving and gracious Father who wants what's best for us. We might not understand all that happens to us, but He knows what's best.

Christ Connection



The main point for students to understand this week is that Jesus is triumphant - over the world, death, and sin. The Cross is a reminder that we serve a God who conquered evil for our sake, and we are now conquerors of the world. The world, death and sin have lost their power because of the work Christ did on the Cross.



- What are some obstacles within your heart that may prevent you from carrying out God's will and mission?
- How can our doubts and shortcomings make us more compassionate and patient defenders of biblical truth?
- What has God has spoken or revealed to you that you know you need to act upon?
- What biases and prejudices do we need to overcome so that we do not hinder that work?

essential doctrine



**Election** | Election is the gracious purpose of God, according to which He regenerates, justifies, sanctifies, and glorifies sinners. It is consistent with the free agency of man and comprehends all the means in connection with the end. It is the glorious display of God's sovereign goodness and is infinitely wise, holy and unchangeable. It excludes boasting and promotes humility.



God challenged Peter's tradition of "clean" and "unclean" foods to further challenge his perspective of "clean" and "unclean" people. Peter learned that God does not show favoritism but calls His people to proclaim the message of Jesus' death and Resurrection to all people, celebrate His work in their lives, and welcome believers into His family, regardless of their ethnicity.

#### in defense



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


- How should you think about ministering to people who aren't like you?

- How can you reach out to someone who is not like you this week?
- How can you join God's mission in this season of life instead of hindering it?

- What are some ways you can put others' needs first this week?

essential



**Discipleship** | Discipleship is a process that takes place both formally and informally to affect spiritual maturity as people follow Jesus. Informal discipleship, as passages like Deuteronomy 6:4-9 suggest, happens everywhere, in every arena of life. Growing in our faith and deepening our walk with Christ is something that requires our whole life, not just the mind. Formal discipleship refers to periods of instruction. We make disciples through our words and actions, providing verbal instruction from God's Word and non-verbal examples through our lives (Acts 20:17-24).



Jesus came back to break down the dividing wall between us and God as well as the walls that separate people. Through the atoning work of Jesus, we are joined together with Him and the Church as one people of God. As followers of Jesus, we are to celebrate, welcome, and care for all who trust in Jesus.

#### in defense



This is an optional category. If you have something from your week of devos that our students would need to know in defending their faith, explain it here. Don't force it, but if there is something, utilize this portion.




- What excuses might you need to stop believing so that you can live for God more?

The redemption anticipated by the old covenant is fully experienced in Jesus.

**Christ as Priest** | As our Great High Priest, Jesus accomplishes the work of reconciling us to God. He is the One whose perfect righteousness is presented to the Father for our justification. He is the One who intercedes for us before the Father (Hebrews 7:25; 9:24) and prays for us to remain faithful (Luke 22:31–32; John 17).

Christ Connection



Jesus is better than the ancient prophecies and institutions because He is the One who fulfills them. Jesus is the Word of God who came so that we might experience a better salvation through His perfect life, death and Resurrection.

in defense




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- How do you think of Jesus? How does that image of Jesus compare to what we've learned from Hebrews today?

essential doctrine



**Faith** | Biblical faith is resting, or trusting, in Christ alone for salvation (John 3:16–21). More than being simply a mental agreement of historical facts, genuine faith begins with a recognition and confession of the truth of the Gospel (1 John 4:13–16), followed by a receiving of Christ as Lord and Savior of one's life (John 1:10–13). Biblical faith is not blind faith, for it rests on the historical life, death and Resurrection of Christ.

Christ Connection



The examples of faithful men and women in Scripture are a source of strength and encouragement, but they pale in comparison to the life of Jesus Christ, who endured the Cross and its shame with His future glory and joy in mind. Because of Christ's work, our faith and the hope of all who have believed will be fulfilled when He returns. We have assurance of the reliability of God's promises.




- What are some ways we treat faith as something you only need in a crisis? How can you make faith the foundation of your life?

essential doctrine

Connection
